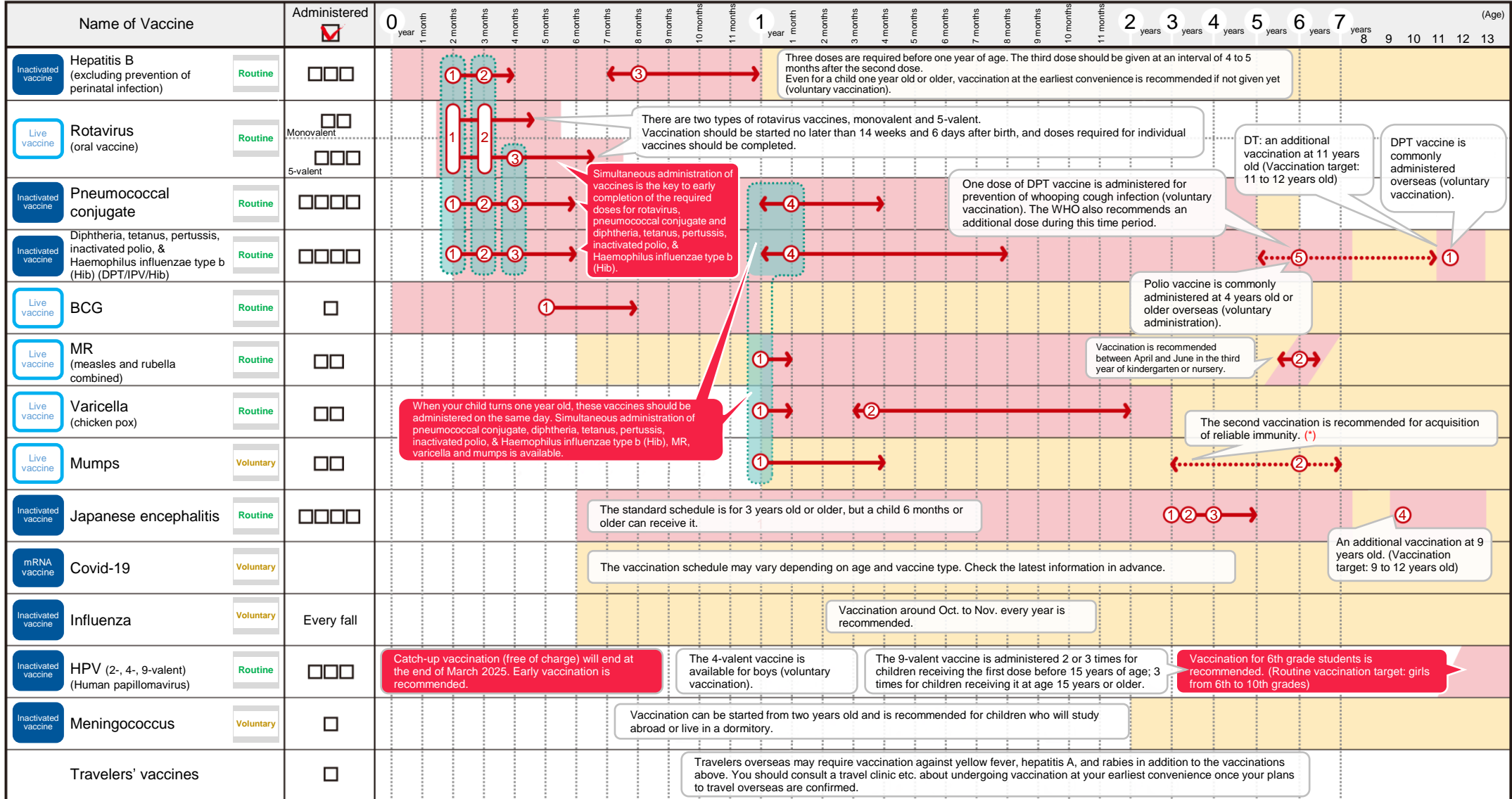


# Immunization Schedule

To protect your precious children from vaccine preventable diseases (VPD), it is important to remember to have them vaccinated as soon as they become old enough to receive each vaccine. This schedule is a suggestion for the earliest acquisition of immunity, made by the KNOW★VPD! Protect Our Children (NPO). You should talk to your child's primary care physician to make an immunization schedule according to the immunization program of your residential area and the outbreak status of VPDs.



- Live vaccine** (Blue box)
- Inactivated vaccine** (Dark blue box)
- mRNA vaccine** (Light blue box)
- Simultaneous vaccination:** (Dotted box)
- Routine** (Green box): Generally free of charge (at public expense) if vaccine is administered during the prescribed period.
- Voluntary** (Yellow box): Mostly for a fee (paid by the individual). Some municipalities provide a subsidy. Voluntary vaccines are as necessary as routine vaccines.
- Target age for routine vaccination** (Pink background)
- Age when voluntary vaccines may be administered** (Yellow background)
- Recommended time period for vaccination (the numbers indicate doses of a series)** (Red double-headed arrow with numbers)
- Recommended time period for vaccination not written in the package insert** (Red dashed double-headed arrow with numbers)
- (\*)** Although not written in the package insert, the second vaccination is recommended.
- At least a 4-week interval is required between injections of different live vaccines. (Vaccination is available again on the same day of the week after 4 weeks have passed.)
